That ministry also remains the context in which Jean Zaru carries out her ministry of receiving groups and delegations of theologians, teachers and youth of all faiths from around the world. For decades Jean has provided leadership among Palestinian Christians in understanding and articulating the faith base of nonviolence; this is a message she has carried internationally until recent years when age and health made those travels more difficult. Through October more than 250 people, in groups of varying sizes have come to the meetinghouse this year to learn from Jean and to share with her. It is a quiet ministry, akin to dropping a stone in a pond, but a ministry of strength and power as those ripples proceed outward to many countries.



Jean graciously contributes her time and energy to this ministry, so the costs are low. Nevertheless, there are the hidden costs of cleaning, heating, administrative support and hospitality—costs that are offset by our contributors generosity.

In other parts of the meeting’s life, the First Day School continues as various adults have the joy of teaching the youngest members of our worshiping community, and at the rise of Meeting there is lively

discussion, refreshments and warm welcome for all visitors. An exciting new development is the possibility of forming a group for Young Adults (30ish). A regular attender of the Meeting who teaches at Birzeit University is exploring this with assistance from Mai Zaru. Mai has completed her studies in the U.S. in special education; and has returned home to serve as the Learning Support Teacher for Ramallah Friends Upper School.

Finally, we want to share the outcome of our Spring Appeal, in which we spoke of the pressing needs at that time for emergency relief for Gaza. Your specially designated gifts, which were combined with those from Ramallah Friends Meeting, totaled \$2,950 for Gaza relief. Through the good services of the United Palestinian Appeal, these funds provided Al-Awda Hospital, in Gaza with desperately needed consumable and pharmaceutical medical supplies.
